## **LOANS AND EXTENTIONS**

The presbytery approved loans for Nampa United Presbyterian Church and the Presbytery. The church will be updating the electrical and sprinkler systems as they expand the kitchen. The Presbytery loans on the Reflections Church building owned by the presbytery were renewed. It is the hope of the Capital Campaign of the Presbytery to be able to pay down these loans substantially.
